


Congratulations to Chaplain Eva J. Brown






Congratulations to First Lady Yvonne Lee

The Richmond MWMW was asked to attend the Armstrong/Walker Football Classic Legacy Parade, on Saturday, November 27. This parade commemorates the legacy of the State of Virginia's greatest annual high school rivalry football game the "Armstrong/Walker Classic". For over 40 years (1938-1978) this special game took place annually on the Saturday after Thanksgiving. There is significant history with the Richmond Fellowship and the Armstrong/Walker Classic. 

Know the warning signs of heart attack and stroke

You could save your life



Heart attack and stroke are life-or-death emergencies — every second counts. If you think you or someone you're with has any symptoms of heart attack or stroke, call 911 immediately.

For a stroke, also note the time when the first symptom(s) appeared. A clot-busting drug received within 3 to 4.5 hours of the start of symptoms may improve your chances of getting better faster.



Heart Attack Warning Signs

Some heart attacks are sudden and intense, but most of them start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. The warning signs are:



 Chest discomfort. Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.



 Discomfort in other areas of the upper body.
 Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.



Shortness of breath. This may occur with or without chest discomfort.



 Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.

As with men, women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. But women are more likely than men to experience some of the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting and back or jaw pain.



Stroke Warning Signs

- Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Sudden confusion, or trouble speaking or understanding

- · Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness or loss of balance or coordination
- Sudden, severe headache with no known cause

The acronym F.A.S.T. is an easy way to recognize and respond to the sudden warning signs of stroke. The letters stand for:



• Face dropping — Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop or is it numb?



 Arm weakness — Ask the person to raise both arms. Is one arm weak or numb? Does one arm drift downward?



 Speech difficulty — Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence such as, "The sky is blue." Is the sentence repeated correctly? Are they unable to speak, or are they hard to understand?



 Time to call 911 — If the person shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 911 and get them to the hospital immediately.



Ingredients

	1 pound dry red beans
	2 tablespoons olive oil
П	12 to 14 ounces andouille sausage, cut into 1/4-inch slices
	½ tablespoon butter
П	1 large yellow onion, diced
П	2 celery ribs, diced
П	1 small red bell pepper, diced
П	1 small green bell pepper, diced
П	6 cloves garlic minced
П	1 teaspoon salt or to taste
П	1 teaspoon dried oregano
	½ teaspoon dried thyme
П	½ teaspoon paprika
	1/8 teaspoon ground cayenne red pepper, or to taste
П	Freshly ground black pepper, to taste
П	6 to 7 cups low sodium vegetable broth, (you can also use chicken broth)

Instructions

- 1. Put dry beans in a large soup pot or a large bowl; cover in water and soak for 8 hours, or overnight. Water should come up about 2 inches over the beans.
- 2. When ready to cook, heat 2 tablespoons olive oil in a large dutch oven or a heavy pot set over medium heat.
- 3. Add the sausage slices to the heated oil and cook until browned on both sides. Stir frequently.
- 4. Remove sausage from pot and set them aside.

- 5. Add butter to the pot and melt.
- 6. Stir in the onions and cook over medium heat for 3 minutes, or until starting to soften.
- 7. Add celery and bell peppers; continue to cook for 4 minutes. Add a little more butter, if needed.
- 8. Stir in garlic and cook for 15 seconds.
- 9. Season with salt, oregano, thyme, paprika, cayenne, and black pepper; continue to cook for 1 more minute.
- 10. Pour in vegetable broth and stir, scraping up all the browned bits from the bottom of the pot.
- 11. Drain the soaked beans and rinse; add the beans to the pot, and previously prepared andouille sausage.
- 12. Add bay leaves.
- 13. Increase heat to High and bring mixture to a boil.
- 14. Reduce heat to low; cover and simmer for $1-\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 hours, or until beans are soft and tender.

Start checking for doneness around the $1-\frac{1}{2}$ hour mark by mashing or squeezing the beans between your fingers. The skin should be a bit resistant to pressure, but the interior should be the consistency and appearance of baked potato.

- 15. When beans are cooked through, remove the bay leaves from the pot and discard.
- 16. Remove 1 cup of beans to a bowl; mash the beans with the back of the fork, and then return to the pot; stir.
- 17. If mixture is too thick, add up to 1 cup water.
- 18. Taste for salt and seasonings, and adjust accordingly.
- 19. Stir in parsley and green onions and cook for 5 more minutes.
- 20. Remove from heat.
- 21. Serve over cooked rice.

"Amazing Grace" is a Christian hymn published in 1779, with words written in 1772 by the English poet and Anglican clergyman John Newton (1725–1807). It is an immensely popular hymn, particularly in the United States, where it is used for both religious and secular purposes.

Newton wrote the words from personal experience. He grew up without any particular religious conviction, but his life's path was formed by a variety of twists and coincidences that were often put into motion by others' reactions to what they took as his recalcitrant insubordination. He was pressed (conscripted) into service in the Royal Navy. After leaving the service, he became involved in the Atlantic slave trade. In 1748, a violent storm battered his vessel off the coast of County Donegal, Ireland, so severely that he called out to God for mercy. This moment marked his spiritual conversion but he continued slave trading until 1754 or 1755, when he ended his seafaring altogether. Newton began studying Christian theology and later became an abolitionist.

Ordained in the Church of England in 1764, Newton became curate of Olney, Buckinghamshire, where he began to write hymns with poet William Cowper. "Amazing Grace" was written to illustrate a sermon on New Year's Day of 1773. It is unknown if there was any music accompanying the verses; it may have been chanted by the congregation. It debuted in print in 1779 in Newton and Cowper's Olney Hymns but settled into relative obscurity in England. In the United States, "Amazing Grace" became a popular song used by Baptist and Methodist preachers as part of their evangelizing, especially in the South, during the Second Great Awakening of the early 19th century. It has been associated with more than 20 melodies. In 1835, American composer William Walker set it to the tune known as "New Britain" in a shape note format; this is the version most frequently sung today.

With the message that forgiveness and redemption are possible regardless of sins committed and that the soul can be delivered from despair through the mercy of God, "Amazing Grace" is one of the most recognisable songs in the English-speaking world. Author Gilbert Chase writes that it is "without a doubt the most famous of all the folk hymns".[1] Jonathan Aitken, a Newton biographer, estimates that the song is performed about 10 million times annually.[2]

It has had particular influence in folk music, and has become an emblematic black spiritual. Its universal message has been a significant factor in its crossover into secular music. "Amazing Grace" became newly popular during a revival of folk music in the US during the 1960s, and it has been recorded thousands of times during and since the 20th century.
